## Shawnee Outdoor Learning Center Included in Mayor Greenberg's State Budget Request and in Governor Beshear's Budget

Wilderness Louisville was thrilled to be included in Mayor Greenberg's request for state funding for Louisville. The Mayor requested \$7 million toward construction of the Shawnee Outdoor Learning Center and the request was included in Governor Beshear's budget. Wilderness
Louisville is in the process of lobbying to be included in the final Kentucky state budget. Thank you to Mayor Greenberg, Deputy Mayor George, Governor Beshear, Council Member Purvis and all the Louisville Council
Members and Kentucky Legislators supporting the project!

## **Projects at Jefferson Memorial Forest**

- The Tom Wallace Improvement Project continues this winter. Stonework around the lake is currently being installed, including picnic areas and designated fishing locations. Project completion is set for late spring.
- The Horine Conference Center is being renovated and will be ready for rentals again in late spring. Stay tuned for an open house revealing all the improvements!



## **NEW DEVELOPMENTS**



#### **Chickasaw Pond**

There is lots of renovation happening in Chickasaw pond. Upon completion this project will include a canoe/kayak launch, designated fishing areas, new pathways around the lake, and a pollinator garden installation in partnership with Olmsted Parks! Chickasaw Pond will also become part of the Fishing in Neighborhoods program with KY Fish and Wildlife. Natural Aeas will be activating this space with programming this summer. #### **Chickasaw Forest Play**

Forest Play construction is complete and Natural Areas has partnered with Olmsted Parks to install the nature play elements and plantings. Prospect Parks has graciously donated River Cane for the Forest Play area, installation will take place in February.

## **Land Management Perspectives**

As in every season, our Land Management team had a packed schedule this winter. The team did a lot of tree planting – they planted 65 trees with the help of Coral Ridge Elementary at the environmental education field, planted 5 trees at our Programs Office and planted 10 trees at the Horine Conference Center. The team also spent time on the trails, inspecting them for improvements, working on erosion mitigation for trails and trimming back overgrowth. Land Management also installed a new bridge and resurfaced another one on the Waverly Park trails. With the help of volunteers Steve Kendra and Bob Dietrich, the team is in the planning / design phase of laying out a new section of trails to add to the already expansive trail network.

The Land Management team has also focused on upkeep of our natural areas by pruning trees and removing dead trees and old stumps from the Horine Conference Center lawn, by removing fallen trees on trails and hazardous trees around Jefferson Memorial Forest, and by continuing - with the help of volunteers removal of invasive species at the Sand Pit. The team also participated in a prescribed burn at Iroquois Park's Summit Field.



The team has also been making improvements by installing new railings around the Waverly Park parking lot, by installing hand railings on the steps at Forest Green Greenway and by installing cedar post and rope borders around landscaping beds at the Horine Conference Center and Welcome Center. The team has also been diligently maintaining the Louisville Loop.

In other exciting news, the Land Management team attended the Kentucky Nursery and Landscape Association conference. Thanks to our Land Management team of staff and volunteers for all you do in making our trails and natural areas accessible and welcoming!
